Did you forget to ask your medical team a question? Here is a list of the most commonly asked questions by patients and carers.

Remember – don't be afraid to ask. Why not tick next to the questions you may feel relevant.

- I've lost my libido; will this change?
- I don't feel attractive anymore; is there anyone that can help me with this?
- Will this infertility last forever or is it reversible?
- Can I store my sperm?
- Can I store my eggs?

- Sex is painful; is there anything I can do about this?
- Will I need hormone replacement therapy (HRT)?
- Will my periods stop for good?
- Can I catch cancer from having sex?
- Could having sex affect my disease?
- Should I avoid sex?
- My feelings towards sex have changed; is there anything I can do to address this?

- I have been told that the radiotherapy treatment I am going to receive, together with the chemotherapy will reduce my chances of getting pregnant in later life. Is this true?

- I have been told that there is no further treatment option available to me; what happens now?
